COMING FULL CIRCLE (what a small world):

One of our dedicated volunteers, Donna Hageman also volunteers for Reading Radio at Youngstown Goodwill. Donna asked me to speak at one of their future meetings and I agreed. I began my talk about the PFS ministry. I was surrounded a friendly attentive audience (in person and many that called in). I spoke about one of my dearest friends, the "late" Sue Brinkman-Drewette as she had taught the visually impaired, the blind, specialized in teaching mobility and so much more. To my surprise some of Sue's students were in my listening audience. They shared what a gift Sue was to them, adding they would not have achieved the success they have today without her. What a heart-warming moment remembering this special person who died in 2014 of Leukemia. THEN ... some retired Goodwill employees who now volunteer remembered my father, Gerald E. (Jerry) Rushton who died in 1993. My dad was instrumental in helping Goodwill with early investments and was on their Board!

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, high inflation, and decrease of SNAP benefits we have seen an **unparalleled** increased need for assistants with food and utility help.

A new 71-year-old client came to us for assistance with his electric bill. He is now one of our pantry regulars who lives on the other side of town so drives a fair way to reach us. He is very grateful for the help during his rough time, and the kindness he receives from everyone here at PFS.

A second senior male client contacted PFS requesting help with his water bill. In the past he had reached out to us for help with medications. He lived with his elderly father who was the primary income provider. Unfortunately, his father died due to Covid-19 complications. Dealing with his father's burial expenses and loss of the household's primary income, he got behind in his water bill. We were able to assist him using our **Elderly Stability Fund Program**. He was very thankful for this emergency assistance.

Protestant Family Service has seen an increased number of households with seniors and households without children coming in for food. I believe this is due to the reasons above and higher cost for food and gas. Without the help of individuals, foundations, businesses, and churches donating food and money we could not meet this increased need in our community. We thank all our donors and all our volunteers.

Yes, it is earlier, but this is to avoid the end-of-season panic we had in 2022.

We really depend on YOU to make this program successful!

Please help us provide gifts for these children in need. The gifts are literally put under the tree for Christmas morning by their parents whom we provided wrapping paper, ribbon, and tape.

- We need to know at least an estimate of how many children you, your group, business, organization, foundation or church will adopt **EARLIER** so we can gage how many applications we can accept from families in need.
- ➤ ON DATE 9/11/23 we will begin taking applications for families with Christmas need EARLIER by appointment (inform anyone in need). *Many families tried signing up at the last minute in 2022, it was heart breaking.
- ➤ ON DATE 11/6/23 we will STOP accepting applications for Christmas help or earlier if resources deplete. Consider putting cards on your Angel Tree EARLIER this year if you use one.

OUR CURRENT PROJECT: BACK-TO-SCHOOL PROGRAM

- ♥ We are accepting monetary donations.

- ♥ We have 80 children now (more on waiting list) and have donations for 60!

PFS is not government funded: We are funded through the generosity of individuals, groups, foundations, businesses, organizations, and churches. In recent years, grants, government surplus food and funding for the purchase of additional food has increased our ability to serve the disadvantaged in our community. **PFS provides assistance** for Back-to-School clothing/shoe, "More Month Than Money" a budgeting class and matching savings program, Crop Walk for Hunger (October), Christmas Assistance (in 2022 we helped 105 families/350 children), emergency food (our pantry usage increased 400% in 2022), utility assistance, family & personal emergencies, Senior Stability Program and so much more. **Our services are available by APPOINTMENT ONLY!** Monday – Thursday 9 am -- 2 pm / Closed Friday and

Utility assistance given to those with provable need: DOCUMENTS REQUIRED are Proper Photo ID / Proof of income / Other proof as requested. **Food is always available:** Other emergency aid is available as funds permit / PFS works in conjunction with other local social service agencies and offers a wide variety of referral and informational services / Protestant Family Service does not discriminate against anyone based on religion, national origin, race, sex, age, sexual orientation, marital status, or physical disability in the administration of our programs. **The assistance PFS provides is only made possible by donations from:** Individuals, churches (all denominations), other groups, businesses, grants, families, church groups, foundations, organizations, food programs/drives, youth groups.

- ♥ Prices of cereal at ALDI's is the best in town! For example, a huge family size 29oz box of Corn Flakes is only \$1.50 and a huge family size 29oz box of Frosted Flakes is around \$3.00.
- We have found **Dollar Tree** has a 3 pack of individually wrapped soap for \$1.25 and **Family Dollar** to have 10 packs of individually wrapped soaps for about \$5.00!
